# A Longitudinal Inter-Professional Ambulatory Clerkship to Prepare for the Third-Year Longitudinal Integrated Clerkship in a New Medical School

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- Inter-professional teams are integral to the future of healthcare.
- Therefore, students must experience authentic, effective inter-professional healthcare in their initial clinical experiences.



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It is not!





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- Enhance team learning and communication skills
- > Promote the value of longitudinal, integrated learning
- Introduce safety and quality improvement as values in medical care



75 Students: 50 1st year medical and 25 1st year pharmacy

12 teams (2:1 ratio) of 6+ each

Responsible for all clinic functions: Front desk

**Back Hallway** 

Pharmacy

Away teams at: pharmacies, pediatrics clinic, retirement community, male sexual health clinic, womens' care clinic, HIV medical home, and private PCP offices.

Teams sign out to one another to ensure continuity of care.



#### **Front Desk:**

- Seeing scheduled patients
- Chart pull
- Check-in
- Check-out (test & referral orders, follow-up visits)
- Walk-ins
- Contacting no-shows and patients with upcoming visits
- Chart re-filing & front desk cleanup







#### **Back Hallway:**

- Seeing scheduled patients
- Preceptor flow
- Room assignment
- Resident & interpreter assignment
- Phone message review & address
- Lab results review
- Cleanup







#### **Pharmacy:**

- Seeing scheduled patients
- Review orders
- > Fill prescriptions
- Medication counseling
- Closet cleanup
- > Inventory







#### **Outcomes:**

Faculty: > Love it

Students:

- > Rated highly by M1s and P1s
- > Many say it is their favorite experience
- Students who lived locally took the initiative to continue the clinic over summer break

Patients:

- > Spot surveys very positive
- > No patients have quit clinic
- Most new patients are referred by existing patients







#### **Outcomes:**

We are looking at .....

- BP control, A1c Hb, patient use of ED
- Formal assessments of whether curricular objectives are being met
- Pharmacy student academic success in comparison with students who did not participate in CCCP.

- □ Sick visits


- □ Patient education
