Is There an "Optimal" Length for the LIC?

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LIC "year" Benefits

- By definition requires TIME
- Optimizes Teacher: Learner relationships
- Optimizes Student: Patient relationships
- Realistic view of out patient medicine
- High volume of Student: Patient encounters
- Development of basic clinical skills



LIC "year" Weaknesses

- Can students become *too comfortable* in the learning environment?
- Does redundancy reduce enthusiasm for self-directed learning?
- Do Clinical *Preceptors become less engaged* in their roles?
- Does the learning curve plateau?
- Is there simply late year burnout?



Optimal LIC clerkship would:

- Continue to stimulate self-directed learning
- Continue to create a positive learning curve
- Continue to engage the preceptor to progressively challenge the student
- Avoid complacency in the learning environment
- Accomplish the objectives of the clerkship
